Diploma in Working with Compulsive Sexual Behaviour Disorder and Sex Addiction (CPCAB Accredited - Level 5)

The Diploma in Working with Compulsive Sexual Behaviour Disorder (CSBD) and Sex Addiction is based on over 20 years' clinical experience of working in the field. Firmly grounded in the latest research and regularly updated, the diploma is designed for counsellors, psychotherapists, sex therapists and addiction professionals who want the confidence to work in this rapidly growing area. The Institute for Sex Addiction Training (ISAT) has been training therapists in sex and porn addiction for 12 years and has trained over 200 therapists to diploma level from all round the UK, Europe and beyond. Our programme includes client interviews sharing their stories and specialist talks from our internationally renowned guest speakers.

The controversy around sex and porn addiction continues and hence it's important that people wishing to work in this field understand the modality within which their training is framed. Whilst research continues to establish how CSBD can be most accurately categorised, sex addiction and porn addiction are still the terms most widely used. As a client facing organisation, the Laurel Centre continues to use these terms and we conceptualise the problem within a pan-theoretical BioPsychoSocial framework. That means we remain impartial and are not committed to any individual conceptual model, focusing instead on the client's individual needs, both physical and psychological, whilst respecting their socio cultural context. Furthermore, with a faculty team including professionals fror psychosexual, addiction, trauma and relationship therapy backgrounds, attendee can be confident that the programme is multi-disciplinary and sex positive.

Format

The course is delivered over three x 4-day modules and is currently being delivered in both a blended face-to-face and online format (September cohorts) and also a purely online format (February cohorts). All training is live and direct with course tutors.

Accreditation requires attendance at all three modules within the same cohort and completion of three reflective mini assignments, a theory essay, a 2,500 word casework assignment based on 12 hours of supervised client work, and a learning portfolio.

Entry requirements

Applicants need to hold a diploma in counselling or therapy (to at least level 4) or an equivalent professional qualification in a related field.

NB. Cohorts are strictly limited to 16 trainees to ensure time and opportunity for reflection, interaction and experiential study and learning.

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MODULE 1 Introduction to working with CSBD

Module 1 provides all the information and skills required to begin working with clients presenting with CSBD. Starting with a thorough examination of the controversies and the impact on clients, trainees will then be introduced to the essentials of developing an objective, impartial biopsychosocial perspective.

Internationally validated assessment tools will be provided along with an exploration of the most effective treatment models to help clients achieve their therapeutic goals. Topics covered include:

- Pan-theoretical concepts and controversies
- Assessment and identifying sub-clinical populations
- Prevalence and common treatment models
- + The role of attachment and trauma
- Neuroscience
- Ethics and working with shame
- The influence of social context and GSRD awareness
- Identifying positive sexuality
- Understanding and breaking the cycle
- Case formulation and treatment evaluation.



MODULE 2 Working with contexts and underlying issues

This module delves deeper into how to work with the common underlying issues that can present with CSBD, whether that relates to causation, correlation or consequence. Cultural differences, related to sexual orientation and identity, relationship difference, faith or race are also explored and time is given to consider how each affects both the perception, formation and treatment of compulsive sexual behaviour. The needs of partners are also considered and guidance given on how relationships can be supported, whoever the presenting client may be. Topics covered in this module include:

- Working with attachment and trauma
- Cross addictions, co-morbidity and neurodiversity
- Working with cultural difference
- + Understanding paraphilia, fetish and kink
- Implications of working with offenders
- Understanding the partner's perspective
- The relational trauma model
- Implications for relationships
- + Recovering the relationship.



MODULE 3 Maintaining recovery and beyond

By the time module 3 is underway, most trainees will be working regularly with clients. This module is designed to consider additional approaches, skills and strategies for helping clients achieve long-term change. Techniques are offered to help clients who are struggling with motivation as well as for those who consistently struggle to maintain their therapy goals. The importance of integrating psychosexual therapy and positive sexuality, as well as the role of group work is also explored. This module will also provide practical tools and encouragement for ongoing clinical evaluation to ensure good practice and ongoing professional development. Topics covered include:

- Working with slips and relapse
- The essentials of positive psychology
- The how and when of sex therapy
- ✤ The role of groupwork
- Applying therapeutic modalities, including psychodynamic, CBT, IFS, EMDR and positive psychology
- Applying clinical skills including mindfulness, ACT, REBT, motivational interviewing and creative techniques
- + The role of ongoing clinical evaluation.
